## **About North Bay Regional Health Centre (NBRHC)**

North Bay Regional opened the doors to its new facility in 2011:

- · Provides acute care services to North Bay and surrounding areas
- · Provides specialized mental health services for Northeastern Ontario
- · Includes Diagnostic Imaging services: x-ray, ultrasound, echo, TEE, CT, and MRI
- · 419 beds, including 136 regional mental health beds
- · Outpatient facilities for pediatric, mental health, and geriatric programs and services.
- · Intentional learning spaces including lounges, on-call facilities, and partnerships with our local LEG, NOSM, PARO, Nipissing University and Canadore College.

**Specialists include:** Anaesthesia, Cardiology, Emergency Medicine, ENT, General Internal Medicine, General Surgery, Gl, OB/GYN, Nephrology, Ophthalmology, Orthopedics, Pediatrics, Psychiatry, Respirology, Urology.



# **About the Emergency Department**

**Our 24/7 department is staffed by CCFP(EM), FRCP(EM), and experienced CCFP physicians from across Canada** in a multidisciplinary team: a Nurse Practitioner, Registered Nurses, Geriatric EM nurses, Respiratory Therapists, social services, pastoral care, crisis intervention, etc. On average, the department sees 160 visits per day.

## **Department Learning Opportunities**

#### High-Fidelity Simulation Lab

Monthly physician-based simulations at Canadore College focus on critical emergency medicine topics. This state-of-the-art laboratory allows for the team to access high-end fidelity equipment and interactive mannequins to replicate real symptoms.

#### In-Situ Simulation

These simulations occur monthly in the Emergency Department at NBRHC, and allow for improvement of team dynamics among all hospital staff.

#### Rounds

Monthly ER rounds are presented by department physicians—a great opportunity for CME and learning among our peers. The rounds are hospital-wide, but focus on emergency medicine topics.

Occasionally, special guests are welcomed to the department to present rounds. In recent years, guest presenters have included Dr. Amal Mattu (School of Medicine, University of Maryland), Dr. Andrew Petrosoniak (St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto), and Dr. Christopher Hicks (St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto).

## Remuneration

#### Nor-Star for Residents

NBRHC offers the Northern Ontario Resident Streamlined Training and Reimbursement program (Ministry of Health, OMA). Residents are reimbursed travel and accommodation expenses on locums, electives, or when providing clinical services under the PARO Restricted Registration Program.

#### Locum Incentives

Locum physicians are competitively remunerated, with travel and accommodation expenses provided.

#### Recruitment Incentive Package

NBRHC offers a Recruitment Incentive Package which includes a \$100,000 signing incentive, and up to \$83,000 through the HealthForceOntario (Ministry of Health) Northern Rural Recruitment and Retention Initiative.

#### Dr. Taylor Lougheed, Chief of Department, Emergency Medicine


